

## Appendix: Round Tables of England, Scotland, and Wales (1230–1330)

This table has been included to demonstrate the number of sources, and what has been explicitly referred to as a ‘round table’ in primary sources. Many Arthurian tournaments have not been referenced in this dissertation as no sources explicitly referred to them as round tables. Future research will likely include an examination of those tournaments that are on this border.

This is not intended as an exhaustive list, rather a step towards cataloguing the round tables of England, Scotland, and Wales in the thirteenth and fourteenth centuries.<sup>139</sup>

Latin conjunctions of the same phrase are not included (e.g. ‘rotundam tabulam’ and ‘rotundæ tabulæ are recorded as the first variation recorded, i.e. ‘rotundam tabulam’)
